2.	<p>Connecting with Traditional Practices</p> <p><i>The HEI may organize week long activities to celebrate the role and importance of IKS. Different departments may organize lectures and conduct short projects recognizing the role of indigenous knowledge in their discipline/area.</i></p>	February
3.	<p>Language Quiz & Trivia</p> <p><i>A fun and engaging activity where students explore India's languages through exploring its rich literature, poetry recitation, debates and cultural facts, promoting multilingualism and cultural awareness as per NEP 2020.</i></p>	March
4.	<p>Digital Literacy & Innovation</p> <p><i>Apprising faculty/students of digital initiatives as envisioned in NEP 2020 to increase awareness and adoption of technology.</i></p> <p><i>With special session on Academic Bank of Credits (ABC): sensitizing students about its advantages and implementation.</i></p>	April
5.	<p>Sustainability & Environmental Initiatives</p> <p><i>Promotion of sustainable community practices and activities encouraging community participation like cleanliness drives, tree planting, waste management, energy conservation projects, and community sensitization.</i></p>	May
6.	<p>Holistic Wellness Activities</p> <p><i>Yoga, mindfulness, art therapy, and health & nutrition programs/activities promoting physical and mental well-being.</i></p>	June
7.	<p>Best practices of the HEI</p> <p><i>SAARTHIs to showcase the best practices of the respective HEI through videos with supporting documents. These best practices may include innovations/initiatives undertaken in context of NEP 2020.</i></p>	July

8.	Nukkad Natak /Booth/Awareness Campaigns during Admissions <i>Street plays to make students aware of relevant social causes such as Anti-Ragging Campaigns/ Drug Abuse/ Tobacco Abuse to etc.</i>	August
9.	Skill development Activities <i>The HEI may organize lectures/orientation sessions related to AEDP, Internship, various schemes of the Government related to Skill education.</i> <i>In addition, students may be give training on resume writing, communication skills, etc.</i>	September
10.	Cyber Smart and Cyber Safe <i>Activities may include Workshop/Hands-on/ Training related to use of digital tools and their safe use for learning, research, and transparency (e.g. AI tools, Cyber safety, Data privacy, etc.)</i>	October
11.	Constitution Day <i>Students and faculty to celebrate Constitution Day with Quizzes/ Webinars/programmes/workshops, etc. befitting the occasion</i>	November
12.	NEP Newsletter from respective institute <i>NEP newsletter from the respective institute, highlighting updates, key initiatives/best practices, activities organized by SAARTHIs/HEI and their impact.</i>	December
